## KNIGHTS KNUGGETS

It wasn't all that long ago that, when a Council project needed manpower, you would hear someone say. "Let's get the Squires to help." Who?

The Columbian Squires is an organization that had its beginnings nearly a century ago. According to Faith and Fraternalism: The History of the Knights of Columbus, it was suggested at the Supreme Council meetings of 1922 and 1923 that a junior Order be established that would "serve to unite, entertain and safeguard the Catholic boys in America."

Trenton, N.J., Bishop Thomas J. Walsh put it this way: "If the Knights of Columbus will take care of the growing boy...then the boy grown into manhood will take care of not only the Knights of Columbus, but of the church and the nation as well."

At the 1925 Supreme Convention in Duluth, Minn., under the direction of Brother Barnabas McDonald, F.S.C, a Christian Brother, the first Columbian Squires circle was instituted.

In 1984, John Paul I Council instituted the John D. Venti Memorial Circle 3086, with the late Brother Knight Harold Gefferich as the founding Chief Counselor. The Circle's banner hangs in our meeting room and its Charter can be found in the corridor outside the meeting room.

Today, the Supreme Council is discouraging the founding of new circles. In the words of Supreme Knight Carl Anderson, "Councils are encouraged not to form new circles, and inactive circles should be disbanded."

### **Don't Assume You Can't Afford Disability Income Insurance**

For the month of February I want to recognize the Laney Family for a lifetime of service. Ron and Angel have been happily married for 54 years. They have two sons Michael (47) and Richie (45). They are the proud grandparents of four grandchildren, the two living with them are Richie (16) and Samantha (15), and the other two are Josh (20) and Justin (15).

Ron joined the United States Marine Corps and was severely wounded in action during his second tour during the Vietnam War. After his medical retirement from the Marines, he attended college through a Veterans Administration Program and successfully completed his Bachelor's and Master's Degrees. Upon graduation he started working for the Department of Justice as a Federal Parole Officer.

Ron retired from the Department of Justice after serving for 35 years in the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention. Most of his career involved training state and local law enforcement officials on child abuse and missing children investigations. Ron served as Associate Administrator of the Child Protection Division which had the national responsibility for major programs such as the Missing Children's Program, AMBER Alert Program, Internet Crimes Against Children Program, National Child Advocacy Centers Program, the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, and other child protection programs.

He continues to help coordinate child protection trainings at four national child protection conferences each year throughout the country. Ron serves on the American Professional Society on the Abuse of Children Advisory Board and he helps facilitate an annual missing children's roundtable for children and families of missing children to help the siblings of a missing child and victims of an abduction. Also on the 200th year anniversary of the Juvenile Court as sponsored by the National Juvenile and Family Court Judges titled: Second Chances, he was recognized as one of 25 success stories of Juvenile Court.

Ron has spent 40 plus years involved with veteran organizations. He is a four time Past Post Commander for the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post #1503, and has served as the Commander for the Military Order of the Purple Heart Semper Fi Chapter # 1775 the last 21 years. Ron is also a Past State

### OVERSEAS COUPON PROGRAM

The Sir Knights of Father Edward L. Richardson SMA Assembly #3174 of the Fourth Degree thank you for your support of the Overseas Coupon Program in which we periodically send coupons to Wiesbaden Army Base in Wiesbaden, Germany, for use at post and base exchanges, and commissaries. We continue to solicit your contribution of MANUFACTURER'S coupons (both food and non-food).

#### **A couple of guidelines:**

- Manufacturer's coupons only. No restaurants, grocery stores, etc.
- Pay attention to expiration dates. Coupons used on the base are good for six (6) months after the expiration date.
- Please separate the coupons into "food" and "non-food" categories. If you eat or drink it for a meal or snack, it's food. Vitamins, medical products, etc., are non-food.
- Due to overwhelming volume, coupons that are not separated into the proper categories will NOT be accepted.
