## KNIGHTS KNUGGETS

If you have ever visited or even seen the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in DC, you're sure to have noticed the the campanile (from the Italian, camp for "bell") or bell tower at the southwest corner of the Shrine. Also known as the Knights Tower, it probably wouldn't exist if not for the Order. According to the Shrine's website, designing of the building began in the 1920s. By the 1950s, as the plans and costs for the completion of the superstructure solidified, it became clear that the tower was a luxury that would have to wait.

However, that changed on Sunday, 31 March 1957, when Supreme Knight Luke E. Hart pledged the funds from the Knights of Columbus to build the campanile.

When our tower was dedicated in 1959, the campanile was without bells. But not for long. We Knights swung into action and came up with additional funding for the purchase of the carillon.

On the day the carillon was dedicated, Sept. 8 1963, Archbishop Patrick Boyle expressed his gratitude thus: ". . . to the members of the Knights of Columbus, in the name of the bishops of the country, I say we are deeply grateful for this wonderful gift. Long after we are gone, this tower and these bells will be paying honor to God and to his Mother."

The largest of the 10 bells is dedicated to our Blessed Mother. The second is known as the Christopher Bell in honor of the Order's patron.

## BINGO

Our Council BINGO program this past year was the best in six (6) years. It continues to be a very successful program to the Council because of the support from many Brother Knights. This program has allowed us to build our own Council home and subsequently provide for the expansion of our Council home. The support some of you have provided to the Bingo program has enabled our Council to conduct many social events and charitable activities, while supporting our Church and Community. The lifeblood of the Council home remains the Bingo program and the success of the Bingo program depends on all Brother Knights and support from our membership.

Although the Bingo program has been successful for many years, one area of concern for me is the lack of participation/support from many of my Brother Knights. This is very troubling for me. I receive outstanding support from the Callers, Team Captains, and Bingo Treasurer. Unfortunately, many have been doing this for many years and we need some others to step up and continue with the success. I also receive outstanding support from a few on a weekly basis, but this is no way to run any successful program for very long. Being retired military, and having managed our Bingo program for over 13 years, I know what burn-out is. If you are looking for an activity to participate in on a Monday night, come to the VFW hall and support our Bingo program. Your support to the Bingo program, as a volunteer worker or player, no matter how often during the year, is critical and very helpful. For many years, the number one complaint I heard from my Brothers was the smoke at Bingo and therefore the lack of participation was for medical reasons. As of 1 Mar 2018, the VFW facility is a smoke free building.

As 2018 comes to a close, and we enter 2019, I ask for your support. I need your help; more than 70% of our Council Brothers did not work once this past year. If you were unable to help this past year with Bingo because of work schedules or school, maybe you can help this coming year if your schedules have changed. Any amount of time that you volunteer is greatly appreciated and needed. The Council web site lists the Bingo Teams. If your schedules have changed this past year, please advise as our (4) Bingo Team Captains and I can always use your help. If you have questions about the Bingo program/Team assignments, please ask myself or any of the Team Captains. Bingo is conducted every Monday night at the VFW hall on Minnieville Road and eligible members are assigned to one of our (4) Bingo teams 30 days after joining our Council. I look forward to working with you this coming Year, as a Team, to keep our Bingo program successful. Thank you for any support you provide this coming year.

As a reminder, we have adopted a policy to follow in the event of inclement weather. If Prince William County cancels after school activities/County activities due to Inclement Weather, we will cancel Bingo that night for the Safety of all Players and Workers. The Council Web site reflects this policy.

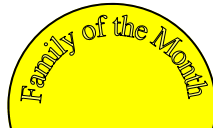

**Christmas Tree Sales Team**

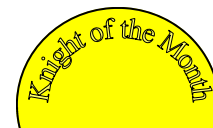

The first Ethnic Dinner Night for 2019 will be an Italian Night on Saturday, January 19th, at the John Paul I Council Home.

The menu will consist of Antipasto on a stick, Cantaloupe wrapped with Prosciutto, dipping Olive Oil with spices and Italian Bread, Italian Minestrone Soup, Caprice Salad, Sausage, Peppers and Onions, Meatballs in Sauce, stuffed shells with sauce and Parmesan Cheese.
