⇒ **Summer 2014 Cook Outs Schedule and Times**

We have made some minor changes this year that we hope will improve the efficiency and accuracy of putting together your orders. This year in addition to making reservations for Chicken, Steak or Ribs, you may also e-mail ahead your order for Burgers, Hot Dogs and Brats. When you arrive, your complete order will be waiting for you at which time you may add or change items except for Steak, Ribs or Chicken. Also your entire family order will be on a single form. For those of you new to the council or those that need a reminder, cook outs are every Friday starting on May 23rd and ending on Friday Aug 22nd. Cook outs start at 6PM and the grill is closed down around 7:15PM. Every Friday, rain or shine.

Every Friday we will have Burgers and Hot Dogs and most Fridays Chicken and Brats.

On June 13th and July 11th we will offer steak (only two times this year).

May 30th, June 27th and July 25th will be JPI Slab of Ribs.

On non steak and rib nights we will also have BBQ Chicken.

Reservations are required for Steak, Ribs and Chicken. Reservations are important because we order what we are going to use, eliminate costly waste, keep the price low and we ensure that you will have what you want. Last year we again had several reservations that were not honored. Hopefully it was an anomaly and will not happen this year. If you do not provide a 24 hour cancelation notice, we expect a payment for your unused reservation. No reservations will be accepted for Brats, they will be first come first serve. Reservations are made by e-mail and a confirmation OK, will be sent back by e-mail. All platters will come with two sides and chips are also available to purchase.

Reservations are now being accepted for our June 13th Steak Night.

END-OF-THE-YEAR AUDIT Rick Castro will again audit our books. Our KC Lady for May was Patti Ann Gleichsner.

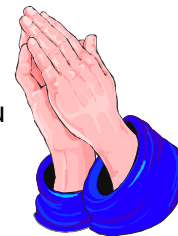

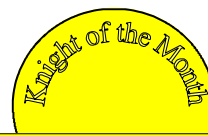
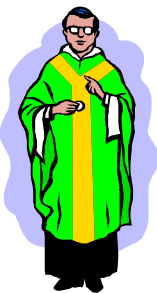
As we honor the dead let us make a new commitment to peace and the ways of conflict resolution.

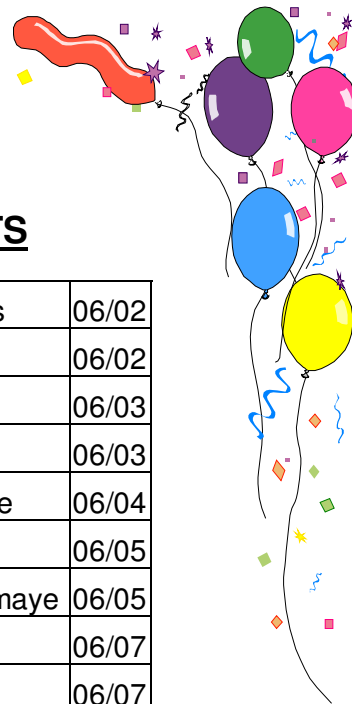
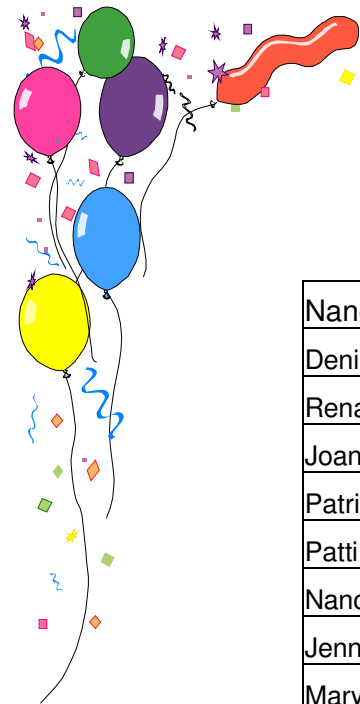

OVERSEAS COUPON PROGRAM

Father Edward L. Richardson SMA Assembly #3174 of the Fourth Degree is participating in the Overseas Coupon Program. We have adopted a military base (Illesheim Army Base in Illesheim, Germany) and will periodically send coupons for use at Post and Base Exchanges and Commissaries.

What you need to do is simple: Bring MANUFACTURER'S coupons (both food and non-food) to your regular council meetings, where they will be collected, tabulated and sent off. It won't cost you a cent. The folks on the base tell me that in the food category, they can really use coupons for baby food. In the non-food category, coupons for pet food and supplies would be greatly appreciated.

A few guidelines:

- ⇒ Manufacturer's coupons only; nothing from local stores like Giant, Safeway, etc. However, KFC, Taco Bell and other fast food restaurant coupons are acceptable because those outlets can be found abroad.
- ⇒ Please pay attention to expiration dates. Coupons used on the base are good for six (6) months after the expiration date. This is a change from our previous guideline of two (2) months, and gives us a bit more latitude so they are not as likely to become outdated between the contribution and delivery times.
- ⇒ We have a box marked "Military Coupons" just outside the clubroom door, so if you can't make it to meetings, you can still contribute by dropping them in the box when you're at the Council Home.

In these days of shrinking defense budgets, the men and women who defend us -- and their families -- will be grateful for what you do.

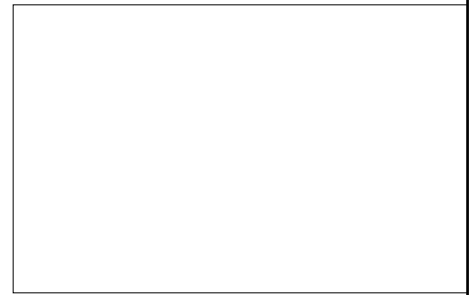
