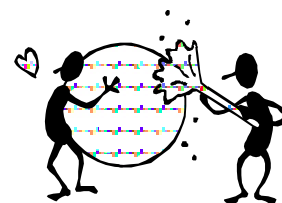

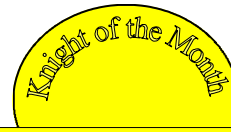

OVERSEAS COUPON PROGRAM

Father Edward L. Richardson SMA Assembly #3174 of the Fourth Degree is participating in the Overseas Coupon Program. We have adopted a military base (Osan Air Base in Osan, Korea) and will periodically send coupons for use at Post and Base Exchanges and Commissaries.

What you need to do is simple: Bring MANUFACTURER'S coupons (both food and non-food) to your regular council meetings, where they will be collected, tabulated and sent off. It won't cost you a cent. A couple of guidelines:

- ⇒ Manufacturer's coupons only; nothing from local stores like Giant, Safeway, etc. However, KFC, Taco Bell and other fast food restaurant coupons are acceptable because those outlets can be found abroad.
- ⇒ Please pay attention to expiration dates. Do NOT submit anything with an expiration date of less than two (2) months from when you bring it. Given the lag time between contribution and delivery, they might become outdated.
- ⇒ We have established a collection point at the Council Home. You will find a box marked "Military Coupons" on the table outside the clubroom. In these days of shrinking defense budgets, the men and women — and their families — who defend us will be grateful for what you do.

LIFE CHAIN



LIFE CHAIN will be on Sunday Oct 6 2:30 to 3:30 along Smoketown Road from Dairy Queen to Bob Evans. This is a silent prayer vigil to end abortion.

Park right at sidewalk, you will be standing along at 5 ft spacing in prayerful chain of silence with your Life Chain sign. Look for Big Tom Thelen or PGK Ted Zeunges as JP1 contacts that day. Signs (6 messages) will be available at Bob Evans sidewalk from Sacred Heart, look for the Sacred Heart sign there. This is a great event for Family. Prayers are on back of signs you hold for your use during the hour.
